PURPOSE:

To provide pertinent information regarding the proper procedure for the management of an extravasation of cytotoxic drugs.

PROCEUDRES:

- 1. The extravasation protocol should be initiated as soon as an extravasation of a vesicant/irritant is suspected.
- 2. Initiate the following steps in the event of any extravasation of a chemotherapeutic agent.
- 3. Notify the physician at the time of the occurrence and obtain orders.
- 4. Put on latex gloves to minimize personal exposure to any chemotherapeutic agent or blood.
- 5. Terminate the chemotherapy infusion at first sign of a problem with flow, pain, or color change at the site of injection.
- 6. Disconnect IV tubing and attach syringe directly to the extension tube.
- 7. Withdraw as much blood or extravasated fluid as possible from the site using slight negative pressure through a 10ml syringe.
- 8. Refer to Mosby Procedure Guide for specific action for specific drugs.
- 9. Observe the site for pain, erythema, induration and /or necrosis.
- 10. Document the following:
 - a. Date
 - b. Time
 - c. Type of access
 - d. Location of access
 - e. Drug sequence
 - f. Drug administration technique
 - g. Approximate amount of drug extravasated
 - h. Patient response
 - i. Appearance of the site
 - j. Physician notification
 - k. Follow up measures
 - 1. Document the incident according to institutional policy
